You can be a 95% scorer in your exams but it takes a lot more than a great mark sheet to help you secure a seat at, say, Harvard University or St. Stephens.




So, why does your Non-Academic Profile matter?

Universities in India and abroad have been growing increasingly selective about candidate profiles. So while the number of students applying to the colleges has increased every year, the number of seats available in these colleges has hardly increased at all.



For example, in India, around 10 million students seek college admissions every year, out of which a mere 0.5 million are able to make it to the top colleges globally.
