



First up we have USA

We begin with Ivy League.

The Ivy League is a group of 8 private Universities in Northeastern US which are known for their

- academic excellence,
- brand name and
- low acceptance rates.

We will be discussing about a few of them in detail:

So we begin with the University having one of the lowest acceptance rate of 4.4% in the world! Yes, it is Harvard University!

So, what does Harvard take into account while considering potential undergraduate student applications?

Now, that's a TOUGH question to answer, but we have identified a list of 4 criteria on which Harvard assesses candidates:

- VE RI TAS HARVARD
- 1. **Growth and Potential:** Assesses if a student is driven and motivated to achieve his or her goals in life.
- 2. Interests and Activities: Evaluates if a student has diverse interests and its application in their everyday life.
- 3. **Character and Personality:** Explores the different aspects of a student's personality indepth.
- 4. **Contribution to the Harvard community:** Assesses if a student will be the right-fit for the pressures and opportunities available on campus.

Did you know?

Harvard has an additional Application Tips section in its admission process which helps students to upload their portfolios in the form of research papers, art work , music recordings, etc!

Next, up we have Yale

Yale is known for its liberal arts pedagogy and is one of the top ranked universities in the world.

What does Yale look for in potential student applicants? It assesses candidates on the following three criteria:

- 1. Academic Rigour: Checks for academic drive and consistency over a period of time which it checks through candidate's teachers' evaluations.
- 2. **Resourceful:** Evaluates the innate ability of the candidate to make the best possible use of his resources based on his high school experience.



3. **Contribution to Yale Community:** The diverse interests which a student holds, helps in identifying his potential contributions to the community on campus.

After Yale, we move to Princeton, another prominent Ivy League college which has been known for its research and record low acceptance rates.


What does it take to be an undergraduate student at Princeton? As per the admission officers at Princeton, they look at the following four main attributes in students:


- 1. Academic accomplishment: Assesses a student's academic record over a range of avenues like high school transcripts, teacher evaluations, competitive scores, etc.
- 2. **Intellectually curious:** Evaluates how a student has been able to extend beyond his limits through co-curricular activities, internships,work experiences, etc.
- 3. **Well-rounded:** Explores the candidates skill sets in detail. This includes his leadership skills, collaborative and team management skills, etc.
- 4. **Diverse Profile:** Princeton evaluates a student's extracurricular activities to gauge his passion and drive to excel.

Rounding up our Ivy League section is Dartmouth College which is one of the oldest educational institutions in the United States. It has been consistently ranked in the Top 10 Universities in the US.

Dartmouth looks at the following parameters while assessing student applicants:

- 1. Academic Rigour: Consistent academic grades signalling improvement in performance are looked at favorably.
- 2. **Personality and Character:** Assesses a student's internal traits through his passion. This includes evaluating his interests through ECAs, volunteer work, etc.
- 3. **Diverse Profile:** This includes factors like if the candidate is a first generation applicant, personal experiences, legacy applicant, athlete, etc.


Let's start off with the University that boasts of the lowest selectivity rates in the world at 4.3%, yes even lower than that of Harvard's!

Yes, you got that right, it's Stanford University.

Stanford University is known for its intensive research and proximity to the Silicon Valley and its wide alumni network which makes it as one of the most sought after colleges worldwide!

Stanford has a list of four parameters which it checks for while evaluating candidates:

- 1. Academic Excellence: Candidates are evaluated on their high school transcripts, academic performance and potential to succeed.
- 2. **Intellectual Vitality:** Through this a candidate's ability to initiative and seek out opportunities are gauged.




- 3. **Extracurricular activities:** This parameter is assessed through the depth of ECAs that the candidate has been involved with.
- 4. **Personal Context:** A student's family background, life and work experiences and many such factors are taken into account while evaluating his profile.

We all have heard of Massachusetts Institute of Technology, famously known as MIT which is the leading center of STEM oriented research. It has been a consistent name in the Top 10 Universities in the world!

So what will it take for you to land at this coveted college? Well, MIT looks at the following criteria while assessing student applicants for its uber-competitive courses:

• Initiative: Helps in understanding a student's drive to excel and how well they have been utilizing the resources available to them.



- **Risk Taking:** Assesses students on their quality of resilience si as to gauge how well they can handle failure as much as success.
- Hands-on creativity: Looks at the practical bent of mind and how the student applies the same to real world problems.
- Intensity, curiosity and excitement: Helps in evaluating if the student has been exploring things and how deeply rooted he has been with the mentioned activities.
- **Contribution towards the MIT community:** This is an integral part of evaluation as it helps in determining if the student applicant is a best-fit for MIT.
- **Balanced profile:** This parameter helps in understanding how a student handles his downtime especially in school. This is gauged through what he indulges in.

Next up is Duke university which is a private, non-profit research university which has been a consistent leaderboard star on Top 10 Universities in the US.

Duke looks at the following two major parameters when considering applications for its undergraduate degree courses:


- 1. Academic Rigour: The first benchmark for all the student applicants is to demonstrate their academic credentials through their SAT scores, GPA, coursework selection, etc.

- 2. **Talent and Ability:** A student's involvement in ECAs, co-curriculars, volunteer work, etc. helps in understanding his passion and interests.
- 3. **Personal Profile:** This is assessed on a myriad of factors like: Geographic residence, first generation to attend college, etc.

Next we have the leader in innovation which has left behind Universities like Stanford and MIT, to emerge on top. It is none other than Arizona State University (ASU).

ASU considers the following 3 parameters while assessing undergraduate applications:

- 1. Academic excellence: ASU assesses this parameter through class rank, SAT/ACT scores, high school transcripts, etc.
- 2. **State Residency:** For applicants belonging from Arizona, considerations are made.
- 3. **Extracurriculars:** This factor is considered to showcase a candidate's application in terms of his interests and passion.

Now let's shift our attention to Purdue University, which has been a world renowned university in science, technology, engineering and math.







Admission officers at Purdue look at the following criteria while evaluating student applications:

- 1. **Academic Excellence:** A candidate's overall grade pattern with special focus on courses in which major is intended are looked at closely.
- 2. **Diverse Profile:** Student's are evaluated on their drive to excel which is showcased through their ECA participations, personality traits, leadership opportunities, etc.
- 3. **Personal Experiences:** These factors include factors like first generation to attend college, residency, volunteering associations, etc.

The acceptance rate at Purdue University stands at 57% which makes it a moderately selective college.

The University of Illinois at Urbana – Champaign considers the following parameters while evaluating a student's application:

Next up is the legendary University of Cambridge which has also been the oldest universities in the world which has been a dominant force in the world university rankings, just like the University of Oxford.


The University of Cambridge looks at the following three parameters when it comes to evaluating applicants for its undergraduate courses:





- 2. **Personal Profile:** A candidate's true passion and interest is showcased through his extracurricular activities, internships, etc. which are looked at favorably.

Next, next up we have the world leader in social sciences and research, the London School of Economics and Political Science, also famously known as LSE.

LSE looks at a range of attributes while evaluating candidates for its competitive undergraduate courses:

- 2. **Personal Profile:** Highlighting experiences like volunteer work, training, internships and the like can be highlighted in one's personal statement to showcase interests.





Now, let us move over to Wales' premier Cardiff University which is known for its outstanding research output.

The University looks at the following criteria while evaluating students for its undergraduate courses:

- 1. Academic Rigour: Scores from SATs and ACTs are evaluated with great detail and this varies across the disciplines being applied to.
- 2. **Diverse Profile:** This parameter includes evaluation on leadership and social skills through a student's internship, work experience and ECAs.



And it's time for us to wrap up the U15 with University of Western Ontario. It is now referred to as Western University and has been known for its successes in research and teaching.

It looks at a holistic profile while assessing applicants to its undergraduate programs, through:

- 1. Academic Excellence: The University of Western Ontario evaluates a candidate's high school transcripts. Scores from SATs and ACTs are evaluated with great detail and this varies across the disciplines being applied to.



- 2. Resume Template

Coming up is, Concordia University which is Canada's most innovative and diverse universities.

It looks at the following factors while evaluating undergraduate applicants:

- Academic prowess: A strong academic background is considered during high school as well as competitive examinations.

- 2. **Diverse Profile:** This includes supernumerary seats for students joining in from the Sports category. A trial and an interview are included in this.





- 1. Academic Rigour: The SLAT (Symbiosis Law Entrance Test) score is considered for shortlisting student applications.
- 2. **GD** and **Personal Interview** are conducted to evaluate a student's critical thinking, personality and communication skills.

Now we have a special section on Architecture, Fashion and Journalism:

First let's discuss a bit of Fashion which is undoubtedly the realm of National Institutes of Fashion Technology (NIFTs). These are the leading colleges when it comes to fashion and design.

NIFT looks at the following while evaluating applications:

- 1. Academic Rigour: Scores from General Admission Test and Common Admission Test are considered.
- 2. **Diverse Skills:** Portfolio submissions are evaluated for creativity, observation and passion.

Next, for our aspiring journalists we have Symbiosis Institute of Media & Communication located in Pune.

It looks for the following while evaluating candidates:

- 1. Academic excellence: Symbiosis entrance Test (SET) scores are used for shortlisting candidates. This is followed by a written ability test.
- 2. **Additional skills:** Studio test and Personal interaction are evaluated to know a candidate's personally.

For Design we have the National Institutes of Design (NIDs) which is the leading Design college in the country.





NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF DESIGN

NIDs look at the following while assessing applicants:

- 1. **Academic Excellence:** The Design Aptitude Test (DAT) score is used to shortlist candidates.
- 2. **Personal Skills:** Candidates creative, social and communication skills are evaluated through sketching, model making, presentations, GDs, etdc during their studio test. Post this, a personal interview round evaluates a candidate's overall personality.
