O.P. Jindal Global University (JGU) was established in 2009 as a nonprofit institution, with the mission of being a private university promoting public service. As testament to our success over a short period of time, in March 2016, JGU was awarded the highest 'A' rating by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), India's national accreditation body.

JGU is located in the National Capital Region of Delhi. It has a state-of-the art, self-sufficient and residential campus, housing about 3500 students, more than 300 faculty members, and 300 staff members. In a short span of eight years, JGU has established six interdisciplinary schools offering undergraduate, postgraduate and doctoral degree programmes – Jindal Global Law School, Jindal Global Business School, Jindal School of International Affairs, Jindal School of Government & Public Policy, Jindal School of Liberal Arts & Humanities and Jindal School of Journalism & Communication – and other research and capacity building institutes. JGU will launch its seventh school, the Jindal School of Art and Architecture in 2018.

Jindal School of International Affairs

Jindal School of International Affairs (JSIA) is India's first global policy school. JSIA has been offering a 2-year Master's degree in Diplomacy, Law and Business - M.A. (DLB) since 2011. The B.A. (Hons.) Global Affairs programme was launched in the Academic Year 2015-16. It has been designed as India's first ever inter-disciplinary undergraduate degree to train students for international careers through basic learning in world affairs. JSIA has now opened admissions to the B.A. (Hon.) Global Affairs programme for the academic year 2018-19 (classes for 2018 batch will commence on 1stAugust 2018).

Study Plan

- Year 1 During the first year of coursework, emphasis is on making sure that students acquire strong foundations in the social sciences. They will read the classic texts in Philosophy, focus on key concepts in Economics, and review the main outlines of global politics in History. Most importantly, they will rigorously practice expressing themselves both in writing and in speech to learn how to effectively communicate their ideas.
- Year 2 In the second year, JSIA's faculty will begin pushing students to develop solid research and analytical skills so that they can begin to take control over their own learning. The faculty would like them to find something that they are passionate about and become a specialist on it. Students' increasingly advanced coursework will help as they start examining how politics plays out in specific regions of the world. They will also be moving from the general to the more specific as they enter into new subdisciplines like Foreign Policy Analysis, Conflict Studies, and Development Studies.
- Year 3 By the third year, students will deeply immersed in the nitty gritty of contemporary global politics. How do individual international organizations work? How do diplomats operate on a dav-to-dav basis? Are changes in military technology fundamentally reshaping the global balance of power? Under what circumstances is international trade a benefit to societies? What is the role of media in today's networked world? The coursework at JSIA can be supplemented with an international exchange in a different part of the world, which will give you first-hand experience with the world's diversity.

Six reasons to study B.A. (Hons) Global Affairs

- To acquire a holistic understanding of international political theory and greater understanding of international affairs.
- To develop a specialized field of knowledge by choosing one of the several available fields of knowledge tracks.
- To develop an in-depth understanding of a region by opting for various study abroad programmes available with top ranking educational institutions across the globe.
- To apply systematic methodological research and analysis, and historically contextualize contemporary global events.
- To develop the ability to think, work, study and conduct research independently.
- To develop a wide range of intellectual, practical and language skills which will enable programme graduates to consider a wide range of post-graduation employment options.

Programme Modalities

- The B.A. (Hons.) (Globa Affairs) is a 3-year programme. It is an on-campus residential, full-time, five-day-a-week degree programme. Students graduate with B.A. (Hons.) (G.A.) at the end of 3 years.
 - Foreign language training is an essential requirement and language classes are offered throughout the duration of the programme. Students have the option of choosing among Mandarin Chinese, French, Spanish and Arabic.

Optional Fourth Year: Students can opt to continue in JSIA after graduation to study the Masters in Diplomacy, Law and Business and to become eligible to apply to American Universities for a Master's degree.

Semester Abroad and Degree Abroad Opportunities

- JSIA provides students with the opportunity to learn from world renowned professors from prestigious international institutions.
- JSIA has a number of student exchange programmes with some of the top schools in international affairs. These include Indiana University's School of Public and Environmental Affairs (SPEA), U.S.A.; Bush School of Government and Public Service, Texas A&M University, U.S.A.; School of International Service, American University, U.S.A.; Ryerson University, Canada; Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Wroclaw, Poland; Centre for European Studies, Katholieke Universiteit (KU), Leuven, Belgium; Faculty of Humanities, Leiden University, The Netherlands; National Tsing Hua University, Taiwan; Kyung Hee University, South Korea; and Ritsumeikan Asia Pacific University, Japan.
- B.A. (Hons.) (G.A.) students can also opt for summer schools at the University of Oxford, U.K.; the University of Granada, Spain; and the Fletcher School at University of Tufts, U.S.A.
- B.A. (Hons.) (G.A.) students also have an option of studying at Geneva School of Diplomacy, Switzerland to earn a second Bachelors Degree in Global and International Studies through academic collaboration with JSIA.

Amenities and facilities available in the campus

- University halls of residence for students consists of several blocks of buildings designed by a French architect.
- The university has 24-hour health centre. A full time medical residential medical officer and nurses are on duty 24x7 on campus. Medicines are provided as per doctor's prescriptions. In addition, an Ambulance facility and on campus pharmacy is also available on a 24x7 basis.
- JGU has employed Washex hospitality solutions as the sole and integrated laundry service provider on the campus.
- The campus has 130 well trained male and female security guards + night patrolling by armed guards + a strong perimeter wall with security lights + over 450 CCTV camera at strategic points round-the-clock
- Sports and fitness activities are an integral component of the university with badminton court, table tennis, basketball courts, cricket ground and practice pitches, tennis court, football, volley ball court, gymnasium, yoga and aerobics
- Fully wireless campus with high-tech classrooms and modern halls of residence.
- Food services are available in the dining hall of the university on self-service basis. World class food court with wide range of vegetarian and non-vegetarian.
- An ICICI Bank branch is available on campus. There are HDFC, ICICI and Yes Bank ATMs too.

The aim of the scholarship, which is of variable amount, is to nurture, encourage and support outstanding women to enter the field of international studies.

Savitri Jindal Merit-cum-Means Fellowships

This fellowship is for outstanding students who may not otherwise be able to afford the full fees of the B.A. (Hons.) (G.A.).

Naveen Jindal Young Global Scholarships

The aim of the scholarship, which is of variable amount, is to nurture, encourage and support young global leaders. It will be awarded on the basis of an independent selection process, which includes an assessment of the candidates grades in his/her 10+2 level of schooling or its equivalent, extracurricular achievements etc.

Haryana Domicile

Meritorious Haryana domicile students qualify for fee concession to study at JSIA.

ADMISSION PROCEDUR

Admission Procedure

Applicants to the B.A. (Hons.) (G.A.) at JSIA must have successfully passed the examination at the 10+2 level of schooling or its equivalent. Students who completed 10+2 in 2017 can also apply. This course is open to students from any stream including Arts, Commerce, Science etc. All applicants should fill the B.A. (Hons.) (G.A.) admissions form and register for mandatory Jindal Scholastic Aptitude Test (JSAT). Both can be done through the JSIA website at http://www.admissions.jgu.edu.in/jsiaadmissions. Applicants must take the JSAT conducted by Pearson VUE at various centres and obtain the requisite score. Candidates having valid scores in SAT/ACT are exempted from giving a JSAT score.

Educational Loans

JGU has established tie-ups with AVANSE (ICICI), Dena Bank and Craedila (HDFC) to facilitate educational loans for students who are admitted to the B.A. (Hons.) (G.A.) programme.
