Our Undergraduate Programme Structure


Ashoka University offer a three-year BA/BSc Honours in the student's choice of major. Students can then do an optional one-year Post-Graduate Diploma in Advanced Studies, Research and Practice, called the Ashoka Scholars Programme.

Students will explore a broad set of disciplines through twelve Foundation Courses. Each student will select an area of specialisation from a list of pure majors and a set of interdisciplinary programmes, based on his or her interest and aptitude. This will allow students to discover their passion, develop a multidisciplinary perspective and have a holistic learning experience. Students will participate in intensive seminars to help develop their reading, writing, communication and critical thinking skills.

In the fourth year, Ashoka's unique one-year Ashoka Scholars Programme will combine a grass-roots, real-life, academically rigorous research project with a set of electives that prepares them for higher studies, research, teaching, corporate jobs, non-profit careers or entrepreneurship. In its first term, the programme will cover the Ashoka Quest, a unique experiential leadership project; in its second term, students will choose a set of four to six electives from across the university that prepare them for their area of career or research interest. If taken in sequence, the three-year programme together with the post-graduate diploma programme will also meet the requisite four years of college-level education for post-graduate study in the US, Europe, and elsewhere.

Our Schools, Centres and Curriculum Structure







Liberal Education at Ashoka University

At Ashoka we believe that the university is a space for intellectual growth, exploration and expression. It is here that students are equipped to think critically, develop a spirit of inquiry and study various intellectual traditions. Together these facilitate the emergence of ethical, sensitive and responsible members of society. In keeping with such a holistic model of learning, we have embraced the liberal education ideal as our philosophy. A liberal education transcends the boundaries between arts and sciences, theory and practice, careers and lives. Our students will learn to seek answers for themselves. This will not only enable them to expand their intellectual horizons but also prepare them for fulfilling careers. Students grounded in a liberal education will be able to analyse difficult problems, formulate precise questions, and think about any issue from multiple perspectives.

- Higher education and research: In the best liberal education institutions abroad, over 95% in a class pursue the highest degree possible in their chosen discipline. In India it is less than 1%. A good foundation in liberal education will inculcate a love for learning and pursuit of knowledge in the students.
- Professional skills: The 2012 NASSCOM Report shockingly revealed that only 25% of graduates in India are
 found employable. Some of the reasons highlighted by the report are lack of communication and leadership
 skills, analytical reasoning, and critical thinking. These are the strengths of a broad-based liberal education
 that Ashoka offers with its Centre for Writing & Communication.
- Entrepreneurship and leadership: Aspiring entrepreneurs need to be creative thinkers with an ability to solve complex problems. They also need a strong grounding in the values of perseverance, innovation, passion, ethics and social responsibility. Ashoka's liberal education system supported by the Centre for Entrepreneurship and Leadership is geared to inspire and support young graduates to develop unique ideas and build enterprises that will have an impact on the world.



Admissions Process & Timeline

Selection Criteria:

Evaluation of candidates takes into account:

- 1. Intellectual curiosity
- 2. Academic performance
- 3. Extra-curricular achievements
- 4. Personal context

Process:

- A. Register online or download the application form
- B. Submit the Application Dossier
- 1. Academic Performance through class X, XI and XII, or equivalent
- 2. Extra-curricular activities
- 3. Essays
- 4. Letters of Recommendation (optional)
- 5. SAT score (optional)
- C. Personal Interview (if shortlisted)

Our Flagship Postgraduate Programme





The Young India Fellowship started with the vision of developing committed leaders through a multidisciplinary programme guided by eminent scholars and visionaries of our time. From a class of 57 students in 2011, the programme's intake grew to 100 in 2012, and 200 students in 2014.

Over the last two years, Fellows have been supported by scholarships worth INR 13 crores to ensure that every deserving candidate is able to attend this programme without any financial constraint. The YIF is one of the most sought-after programmes in the country and attracts graduates from institutions all over India — the IITs, IIMs, National Law Schools, University of Delhi and National Institutes of Design.



Frequently Asked Questions

1. Why should a student apply early to Ashoka University?

We follow rolling admissions, which means there will be more seats and hence a higher chance of selection. There is also a higher chance for deserving students to earn need-based scholarships, which will progressively decrease in later rounds.

2. When do students have to declare their majors?

Applicants have to indicate their 'preferred major' at the time of the application. However, this is not binding in any way. They will have to declare their final major only at the end of the second year and this could be the same as their 'preferred major' or different from it. The Foundation Courses will offer ample opportunity to explore different disciplines and help them finalise their area of interest and specialisation from a list of pure and interdisciplinary majors. Students can also choose to take more courses in their preferred major in the first two years.

3. How many full-time faculty will Ashoka University have?

The undergraduate programme's second batch will begin classes in September 2015 with 40 full-time faculty members, 30 tutors and visiting faculty from reputed institutions around the world.

4. With which university is Ashoka affiliated?

Only colleges are affiliated to Universities. Established under the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006, Ashoka University is an autonomous university in its own right. Hence, it does not need to be affiliated to any other university.
