
COLLEGE CAMPUS

Spacious in dimension, the main college building is a masterpiece of architecture-a blend of Mughal, Rajput and Sikh Styles. The college campus covers an area of over 330 acres and provides latest amenities of Higher Education. It is flanked by Chemistry, Computer and Physics blocks on western side and Library, Sikh History, Postgraduate, Biotechnology and Canteen blocks in the eastern side. Sikh History & Research Department, that came into being in 1930 contains a reference library and a gallery of thousands of manuscripts, rare books, portraits and paintings of great historical significance and value.

The College is partly residential with five hostels namely Nabha, Faridkot, Hargobind, Jind & New Jind (for boys) and five hostels for girls providing accommodation to 1250 students. The campus also has within its premises a Gurudwara, Gymnasium, Nursery, Fruit Farm, Cricket Stadium, sprawling Playgrounds (Including Athletic Track, Basket Ball, Volley Ball, Football, Hockey and Cricket Grounds) Swimming Pool, Fully Computerised Library, Career Guidance Cell, Placement Cell and Student Activity Centre. Infra structural development in the college is a regular feature. New Buildings of Administration Block, Agriculture Department, Girls Hostel, Student Cafeteria were constructed last year. Newly constructed washrooms for girl students and provision for R.O. filter drinking water in the college and hostels were other highlights of the year.





Divinity

The devout religious minded founders of the College attached highest importance to the study of religion and the cultivation of moral values among the youth. The College imparts regular religious guidelines, but there is no compulsion of any kind for non-sikh students. Prayers are held in the College Gurudwara in the morning and evening and resident members and students are motivated to attend the prayers. The Sikh students are also expected to partake 'Amrit' and participate in the celebrations of the Gurburabs and other religious functions.

The new session always begins with 'Ardaas Divas' to seek blessings of the Almighty. Examinations in Divinity are held periodically and scholarships and prizes are awarded to the best students. It is mandatory for Sikh students to wear turban. They are restrained from wearing patkas and caps in the College Campus. 'Nagar Kirtan' on the eve of Guru Nanak's birthday is a salient feature of the College since 1915. All the students and staff members participate enthusiastically. 'Dastaar Competition' is held in the last week of August every year to motivate the Sikh students. With the initiative of the management, the College celebrates 'Avtar Purabs' of all the Ten Gurus. All faculty members and students participate in these celebrations.

College Library

A fully computerised library with bar code system provides excellent facilities to the scholars. The total number of books in the library exceeds 1,89,302. It has the distinction of housing one of the finest collections of books. College Library has got associate membership of 'INFLIBNET', which facilitates staff and students to have an access to Periodicals & Books on internet. **The library remains open on all working days from 8.00 am to 6.00 pm** There is a separate Research and Reference Section, Periodicals and Magazine Section and General Reading Section. It subscribes to 103 Journals, 36 Magazines and 21 daily newspapers. Besides this it has procured 4889 back volumes of the subject journals for Post Graduate and Research Sections. The Library collection is well classified, catalogued and kept on OPEN SHELVES in a systematic way. There is also a vocational guidance centre as an allied branch of the Central Library and sectional libraries for the departments of Agriculture, Biotechnology, Botany, Chemistry, Commerce, Computer Science, English, Physics, Physiotherapy, Political Science and Zoology under the charge of Professors concerned.

Students are issued books for a period of 15 days and may be re-issued at the discretion of the librarian for another fortnight but not exceeding a month in any case. A fine of Rupee one per day per volume is charged for each book kept beyond the specified date. Book lost, destroyed or disfigured by any user has to be replaced by the borrower or the user has to pay double the price to the satisfaction of the librarian. Reference books, texts or current periodicals are not issued except with the permission from the Principal. The librarian may recall, if necessary any book even before the expiry of the period. If the date of returning the book falls on Sunday or a holiday, the same can be deposited on the next working day. All the Post Graduate Departments have Departmental Libraries.

Book Bank

In order to help the disadvantaged and deserving students the college provides book bank facility. The section has more than 4800 books. Through this scheme the text books are issued to the needy students for the full academic session.

Hostels

The College provides on Campus accommodation for outstation students. There are ten blocks—five for boys viz Nabha, Faridkot, Hargobind, Jind and New Jind that provide accommodation to 500 students and five for girls viz Bebe Nanki, Mata Khivi, Bibi Bhani, Mata Gujri & Mata Sahib Kaur that accommodate 750 students. Admission to the Hostel is governed by the hostel rules. The right of admission to the hostel is reserved with the Principal.

Under the supervision of Prof. Harbhajan Singh, Director, the Training and Placement Cell focuses on providing appropriate placements to the students. The seminar gave exposure to students regarding Personality Development & Interview Training. Two students from Computer Science Department and one from Economics Department got selected in renowned company Tech Mahindra on January 02, 2017. In a Placement Drive conducted by renowned multinational company “ICICI” on February 17, 2017, 13 Students got placed in the company. A Workshop on “Resume Building and Interview Preparation” was also organized. Mr. Rishab Gupta enlightened students on how to build a resume as it casts an important impression on the human resource managers of the companies.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

NSS unit aims at inculcating a spirit of social service among students and sensitize them towards nation building and welfare activities. Students get an opportunity to participate in programmes like tree plantation, voluntary health service, literacy drive, agricultural development etc. Such programmes help to instill spirit of nationality, equality and fraternity.

The College is running four NSS units of 100 volunteers each. The Coordinators of these units are: Dr J.K Randhawa (NSS Incharge) Dr. Zorawar Singh, Dr Sandeep Singh and Dr. Poonam Sharma. This year the NSS units organized Blood Donation Camp in which 157 students of the college donated blood. The volunteers participated in World Yoga Day. Sports Activities

Khalsa College has always enjoyed a coveted status in sports. In the year 2016-17 at the All India National level the college players bagged 52 gold, 41 silver and 49 bronze medals. In Inter-college (Men) the college won 13 championships, 11 runners up and 8 second runner up positions. In women events 5 first, 2 runner up and 2 second runner up position were bagged by the college.

Khalsa College scored 158 total overall (Inter-college) points in 2016-17, as compared to 139 points in the previous year. The players have brought laurels to the college. Inder Chand Swami won bronze medal in Junior Asia Cup in Archery. Abhijeet won silver medal in cycling in Junior Asia Cup. Ms. Snehal Diwarkar participated in world university games and wrestler Harvinder Singh bagged the title of 'Punjab Kesari'.

The overall points in GNDU in 2015-16 were 15557(Men) and 4568 (Women). This year this has improved to 21910 in men sports and 7458 in women sports. Our players have won cash awards worth 22 lakh. The College has won Inter College Gatka Competition in both men and women section.

Khalsa inter college Diwali tournaments were organised from 22 to 28 October, 2016. All the institutes under the Khalsa College Charitable Society participated in this tournament. Different sports events like Athletics, Cricket, Basketball, Badminton and Volleyball were conducted for both boys and girls. S. Rajinder Mohan Singh Chhina, Honorary Secretary was the chief guest.

98th Annual Sports Day was organized on 24th Feb, 2017, in which 17 events (Athletics and recreational) were conducted both for staff and students.

Annual Sports Prize Distribution Function was organised on 6th April 2016, in which more than 125 outstanding players were honored. Padamshri S. Balbir Singh Sr. was the Chief Guest on this Function and Sh. Rajindermohan Singh Ji Chhina presided over the function.



Cultural Activities







Rules and Regulations

1. Subject combination should be carefully checked to avoid subject clash.
2. Failed/detained/absentee students from any College / University Examination will not be admitted to the college in any case.
3. Such students whose result of the lower examination is notified as 'Result Later' by any Board or University except our college students who appeared as regular candidates, will not be allowed admission to the higher class even provisionally.
4. To maintain the high academic standards in the college the admission criteria for all classes will be laid down by the college authorities which will be either at par or above the minimum requirements of the G.N.D.U./College The decision of the college authorities in this regard shall be final and the criteria may be revised from time to time during college admission period.
5. A student who joins the college and subsequently appears as private candidate forfeits the right to admission in the college in future.
6. A student can apply for more than one course in one session. For each course he/she has to fill in a separate form. In case he/she is selected in more than one course, choice would be with the candidate. As and when the candidate deposits the fee for one course, the claim for the other course will be automatically forfeited.
7. All candidates will pay Registration Fee of Rs. 500/-
8. The candidates applying for the course, where the admission is based on Entrance Test, will pay Registration Fee of Rs. 1200/- (non refundable).
9. **Students who are placed under compartment in 10+2 or Graduate examination may not be allowed admission to the higher class.**
10. Principal has the right to reject admission to the candidates who applied for provisional admission before the declaration of their result.
11. Students admitted provisionally to any class are required to submit

the original certificate of the lower examination passed within 30 days of the admission for issue of University Registration Number to confirm admission by the university. In case of non-compliance of the same the admission of the student shall stand cancelled automatically and the dues paid by the student shall not be refunded.

12. If a student makes a false declaration or conceals any information in the Admission Form, his/her admission to the college shall stand cancelled without any notice as soon as the false declaration or concealed information is detected. The case may be handed over to the police.
13. The Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any candidate, if he is satisfied that the refusal is in the interest of the college.
14. The Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any candidate/student who was involved in strike/agitation or indulged in misconduct or indiscipline in the college/hostel in the preceding year/years or on the basis of interview or otherwise where the Principal is satisfied that the refusal is in the interest of the college.
15. **In case of serious misbehavior, indiscipline, ragging or disturbance to academic atmosphere of the college, absence from class/house test or indulgence in unfair means in any test/examination or possessing mobiles in the campus, the Principal has the right to impose heavy fine or cancel admission and ban his/her entry into the college.**
16. Equivalent examination means that the examination should be duly recognized by G.N.D.U./College as equivalent thereto.
17. Change of faculty or subject within the faculty will be allowed as per G.N.D.U./College ordinance and regulations.
18. **The candidates with gap year after passing Plus Two or Graduation Degree will not be admitted to Graduate or Post Graduate Courses respectively.**
19. A student must abide by the undertaking submitted (if any) at the time of admission, failing which his admission will stand cancelled.

For the Attention of Parents and Students

1. Each student is issued an Identity Card which he/she must always carry and shall produce whenever asked by the college authorities. **No student will be allowed to enter the College premises without the Identity Card.**
2. **The carrying of Mobile Phones in the College is strictly prohibited. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against the violator.**
3. **Students with two wheelers will have to pay a parking fee. Four wheelers and Enfield Motorcycles are not allowed except with special permission from the Principal.**
4. Don't scribble, put posters or litter the campus.
5. Attendance of the students in all college seminars, functions and celebrations is compulsory.
6. Keeping in mind the academic atmosphere of the college, the students (girls/boys) are instructed to wear decent clothes in the college.
7. The lecture statements of students falling short shall be displayed on the college Notice Board. Parents/Guardian of the students/wards are advised to contact respective Head of the Department in the month of September/March to know the status of the lectures attended by their wards. Any student falling short of lectures as prescribed by the University shall not be issued the roll number.
8. No Visitors are allowed to meet students during the college hours.
9. Smoking & Drinking are strictly prohibited. Anybody found drunk or smoking in the College Campus will be immediately expelled.
10. Dispute, if any will be subject to the jurisdiction of Amritsar Court only.
11. In case the student's identity card is lost, he/she may apply for duplicate I card with the copy of FIR lodged with the police.

Note : The parents and the students are required to read the Prospectus carefully before signing the admission form. The responsibility of having read the rules and regulations shall be upon the parents and the students and they shall be bound by same.

Rules for Eligibility for Final Examination

1. The student has to secure minimum marks as stated below in the House Test to make him/her eligible for final examination.

Graduate Classes (Arts, Commerce, Science)

35 % marks in each subject in the house examination OR 25 % marks in aggregate in house examination held by the college.

Post Graduate Classes

25 % marks in each written paper in the house examination and 25 % marks in the seminar work. or 35 % marks in the aggregate of written papers and seminars.

Note : Attendance in the House Tests conducted by the College is compulsory. Any student who fails to appear in the tests will not qualify for the final examination.

2. A student is admitted to the final Examination only when he/she fulfils the above mentioned conditions and his/her form is accompanied by the following certificate by the Registrar of the college.
- a. That the student of Under Graduate Classes (Arts, Commerce, Science) has attended at least 75% of the full course of lectures in theory and practical separately, delivered to his/her class in each subject offered by him/her.
 - b. That the student of B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture Classes, B.Sc. (Hons.) Food Sci. & Tech., M.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture has attended not less than 80% of the full course of lectures in theory and practicals separately delivered to his/her class (as required by G.N.D.U. calendar) in subjects offered by him/her.
 - c. That the student of Post Graduate Classes has attended 75 % of the full course of lectures in theory and practicals separately, delivered to his class in each subject/paper offered by him/her.

Note : The student falling short of above stated required attendance shall not be eligible to appear in the final examination.

Rules of Semester Examination

I. Courses having two semester duration:

- a. There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester.
- b. In case a student fails to pass all the courses/papers within a period of two semesters (One Year), he/she shall be given two consecutive semesters (One Year) more to pass.

II. Courses having four semester duration (P.G. Classes)

- a) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester
- b) However the student shall be promoted to the third semester only if he/she has passed at least 50% courses/papers of the first two semesters.
- c) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from third semester to fourth semester.
- d) In case a student fails to pass all the courses/papers within a period of four semesters (Two years), he/she shall be given four consecutive semesters (Two Years) more to pass.

III. Courses having six semester duration:

- a) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester
- b) However the student shall be promoted to the third semester only if he/she has passed at least 50% courses/papers of the first two semesters.
- c) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from third semester to fourth semester.
- d) However a student shall be promoted to fifth semester only if he/she has passed al least 50% courses/papers of the first four semesters.
- e) **The student shall be promoted to sixth semester only if he/she has passed all the papers of the first semester.**
- f) **After a period of six semesters the student shall be given a period of two consecutive years to pass.**

IV. Courses having eight semester duration:

- a) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester.
- b) However the student shall be promoted to the third semester only if he/she has passed at least 50% courses/papers of the first two semesters, but there will be no condition for promoting a student from third semester to fourth semester.
- c) However a student shall be promoted to fifth semester only if he/she has passed at least 50% courses/papers of the first four semesters.
- d) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from fifth semester to sixth semester.
- e) The student shall be promoted to sixth semester only if he/she has passed all the papers of the first semester.
- f) However, a student shall be promoted to seventh semester only if he/she has passed all the courses/papers of the first two semesters.
- g) After a period of eight semesters, the student shall be given a period of two consecutive years to pass.

Note.

- 1. No special chance or exemption shall be allowed beyond what is stated in the above ordinances.
- 2. Failing students shall appear in the examination in the regular semester examinations next year i.e., reappear of examination for an odd semester shall be conducted along with the next odd semester, and even semester along with the next even semester and there shall be no special supplementary examinations.
- 3. If 50% of the courses/papers required to pass involve a fraction, the fraction of the course/paper will be treated as a full course. For example, if in a year there are 13 courses in two semesters, the candidate will be required to pass minimum of 7 courses/papers.
- 4. The pass marks for a course shall be 35% at UG and PG Diploma levels and 40% at PG level. Pass marks in aggregate for a degree shall be 40% in aggregate at UG and PG Diploma and PG level. Re-evaluation shall be allowed as per ordinances.
- 5. The medium of instruction shall be as already existing in the ordinances.
If a student is detained due to non-fulfilment of lectures and House Examination conditions, he/she will not be eligible to seek admission in the next semester. He/she can get admission in the same semester in which, he/she is detained in the next academic session.
- 6. **Use of mobiles, blue tooth and other electronic gadgets are strictly prohibited in the examination. Any student found using electronic gadgets during examination will be punished as per college rules.**
- 7. The students must report half an hour before the commencement of examination.

Internal Assessment

An internal assessment of 20% has been introduced in all the courses from the academic session 2014-15. The internal assessment will be based on performance in house Examinations, Attendance, Participation in co-curricular activities and classroom conduct/behaviour of the student.

Rules Regarding Attendance

- 1. The students shall be required to attend the lectures (Theory and Practical) as prescribed from time to time. **As per University rules no lecture can be condoned on the basis of medical ground or any other leave.**
- 2. **The name of the student who remains absent without prior permission for more than a fortnight will be struck off the college rolls.**
- 3. Lectures are to be counted upto the last working day before the commencement of the preparatory holidays.
- 4. A lecture will be considered as delivered even if the whole class is absent.
- 5. The Principal may condone the shortage in lectures as per the ordinances of Guru Nanak Dev University, applicable from time to time. While condoning the shortage, if any, the Principal will consider the conduct, behavior and general performance of the student. The student falling short of lectures shall be liable to be detained.

Rights and Responsibilities of Students

For the Attention of Parents and Students

Do you know that as a Khalsa College student,

- a. you have the right to expect a teacher to take your classes on time, sincerely and effectively.
- b. have the right to expect the teacher to grade and evaluate your progress regularly.
- c. own any original work you have produced.

On the other hand, do you know that as a student you are expected to

- a. reach the class on time and remain for the duration of the scheduled class.
- b. submit work that is your own.
- c. expect the faculty members to give assignments for the evaluation of your progress.

It is in the interest of the students of Khalsa College that they should ensure that the learning environment is free from all behaviour that would jeopardize the teaching and learning process. Such behaviour might include, but is not limited to, missing classes, cheating, plagiarism, uttering of false statement to obtain concessions and falsification of information.

- The above fee chart includes University charges.
- Rs. 5000/- as security (refundable) from M. Phil, M.Sc. (Physics/ Maths/ Botany/ Zoology/Computer Science/IT/Biotech/Food Science Technology/MPT and BPT part-I) at the time of admission has been included.
- Rs. 2000/- as security (refundable) for B.C.A., B.Sc. (I.T.), PGDCA, B.Sc. (Biotechnology), B.B.A., P.G.D.F.S., B.J.M.C and M.Sc. (Comp. Sc.), M.Sc. (I.T.) part-I at the time of admission has been included.
- For other courses, security of Rs. 1000/- for Graduate and Rs. 1500/- for Postgraduate at the time of 1st year admission has been included in fee chart.
- The concessional rate of fee to a student belonging to Scheduled Caste/Backward Class is available only if the income from the all sources of the family is not more than 2,50,000 (per annum) in case of Scheduled Caste and not more than 1,00,000/- per annum in case of Backward Class. Such student will produce SC/BC Certificate (with income) and an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper, duly attested by Executive Magistrate appointed by Punjab Govt. for attestation purpose alongwith a copy of Adhaar Card.
- The fee once paid will not be refunded
- The security will be refunded in the month of September/October in the year he/she leaves college. Security will lapse automatically if not withdrawn by 31st March of the following year and no claim whatsoever shall be entertained there after.
- As per the demand of the students Rs. 500/- will be added to Alumni fund from the refundable security.
- Keeping in view the welfare of students the Principal can reallocate any amount realized under one head to another head.
- No student can claim fee concession as a matter of right. The Principal may grant the fee concession on the basis of merit, economic condition, conduct of the students, achievement in sports and other extra curricular activities.

Special Merit Scholarships

- Special Merit Scholarships will be awarded to top brilliant students on the basis of their merit in the admission/merit in the Board/ University Examination as per decision of college authorities from time to time.
- A scholarship will be withdrawn immediately if an awardee indulges in indiscipline or violation of college rules or absents himself/herself in a class/house test.

Note:- (a) The fee includes Examination Fee. No extra fee for Examination form will be charged from the students.

Rules for the Payment of College Dues

- The date for the payment of the college dues for various classes will be fixed and notified by the Principal from time to time.
- A fine of Rs. 10 per day will be charged for non-payment of dues in time.
- Students absent from the College during the fee payment period must arrange to pay their fee within the due date.
- Cheques will not be accepted for payment of College dues.
- Non-payment of College dues within one month of the last day of payment will render the student liable to be struck off from College rolls. Such candidates may be re-admitted on payment of re-admission fee of Rs. 2000/-.
- If a student does not get his/her name struck off from the colleges rolls by applying to the Principal, he will be treated as on the rolls of the College and the dues will be realised for the period of absence.
- If a student leaves the college during any term he/she will have to pay the fees for the whole period of each term except in case of migration.
- Extension in the date for payment of dues and permission to pay in installment may be granted in exceptional cases by the Principal and application for the same may be made before the expiry of the due date.
- The student shall be penalised for absence from the college Functions/ Celebrations, as per notification.

Guidelines for Financial Assistance to the Students Belonging to Backward Classes/Schedules Castes




































The details of the financial assistance given to the students belonging to Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes and Schedule Tribes to complete their College/University Education is as follows:

- Post Matric Scheme of the Govt. of India: Students belonging to Scheduled Castes who are permanent resident of Punjab State and are getting education in any part of India will be sanctioned stipends under this scheme provided the family income from all sources is not more than Rs. 2,50,000 per annum. Students will be given scholarships as per notification of Punjab Government.
- Special Grants for the Girls from Scheduled Castes : Girls belonging to scheduled castes, whose parents are permanent residents of Punjab State and who are studying in the Colleges of Punjab will be sanctioned a grant provided the annual family income doesn't exceed Rs. 60965/-

Instructions for filling the Stipend form : (The Form is available on the site www.punjabscholarships.gov.in)

- The students belonging to SC/BC category should regularly check on the notice board for the necessary information.
- The complete/filled forms should be submitted within fifteen days of admission failing which the student will not have any claim to seek such scholarship.
- The attested detailed marks sheet of the previous exams should be submitted with the form.
- It is necessary to submit the income and Scheduled Caste Certificate duly attested along with the form for the first year .
- The scholarship form must be attested by the Village Sarpanch/ Nambardar / Patwari / Gazetted Officer / MLA/ MP/ Municipal Commissioner.

Note : The scholarship can be withheld or cancelled by the Principal on the basis of unsatisfactory academic progress or immoral character or undesirable/indisciplinary activities. In case the information given in the caste and income certificates is found false/incorrect, the Principal can withhold or cancel the scholarship as well as the admission from college.

33. **S. Jai Singh Jhabal Prize:** Awarded to the students who stand first and second respectively in B.Sc.-III Year.
34. **S. Sadhu Singh Jhabal Prize:** The students of B.A.-III (Arts) who stand first and second respectively in the subject of Political Science are awarded this prize. Two Prizes are awarded to the students of B.Sc. (Agri.) who secure first and second positions respectively.
35. **Mata Manjit Kaur Prize:** Rs. 1100/- to be awarded to the student who stands first in the College in B.Sc.-I(Med.).

Government Scholarships

1. **National Scholarship Scheme :** The students are granted scholarship every year on the basis of the Matric/ +2 and Graduate examinations. The number of scholarships to be given is decided by the Indian Govt. Those students of Matric and plus Two are given these scholarships whose parents annual income is Rs. 25,000/- There is no income limit fixed for the Graduates who are granted scholarships on merit. The scholarship once granted continues till the student gets the degree. It is renewed every year on the basis of the progress shown by the student.
 2. **State Competence Scholarship Scheme :** Under the State Competence Scholarship Scheme, the Punjab Govt. Grants the scholarships for General Education to the students on the basis of Plus Two and Graduate Examinations on merit. The student must be a resident of Punjab and have passed the examination from the institution under Punjab State. The student must seek admission in Punjab State.
- Note:** The Student placed in merit under the National and State Scholarship schemes have to submit their forms to the Head of the institutions conducting examination and the Principal of the educational institutions have to submit these forms after attestation to the Institutions conducting examination within a stipulated period.
3. **Scholarship to promote Hindi for Non-Hindi Speaking Students :** This is a center sponsored Scheme. Applications are invited from the colleges of the state and Scholarships are granted to students who are resident of Punjab State and have passed all examinations from Punjab.
 4. **Scholarship for the Teacher's Children :** The Scholarship is granted to the children of the teachers every year on Merit. The annual income of the parents should not exceed Rs. 25, 000/-An application form for this scholarship can be obtained from the DPI (Colleges) Office, Punjab.
 5. **Scholarship for Students of 1984 Riot Affected Families :** The Punjab State Grants the Scholarship every year to the students who belong to riot affected families (1984). An attested copy of the Red Card by concerned D.C. must be submitted along with the scholarship form.



Stipends and Scholarships

Deserving students are awarded stipends, scholarships and incentives on the basis of their achievements in various fields of academic activity. All public, national, state and university scholarships are tenable in this college. In addition, the college offers following scholarships:

2. **Principal G.A. Wathen Scholarship:** The scholarship of Rs. 150/- per month (for 10 months in a year) is awarded to a bright deserving student boy or girl who would otherwise be unable to have college education,
3. **S. Kartar Singh (Novelty Sweets) Scholarship:** The scholarship of Rs. 100/- per month (10 months in a year) includes 3 scholarships for the students who stand first in B.Sc. Food Technology Part-I/II/III respectively. S. Kartar Singh Scholarship is sponsored by his son S. Bhupinder Singh M.D. Novelty Sweets in the memory of his father.
4. **Sardar Joginder Singh Dhillon Scholarship:** Two scholarships of Rs. 100/- per month each to two deserving merit students, one of the scholarships is given preferably to a student belonging to Gumtala Village.
5. **Sardar Rajinder Singh Scholarship:** Dr. B.N.S. Walia, 58, Sector 5, Chadigarh has offered a scholarship of Rs. 100/- per month (for ten months) in the memory of his revered father S. Rajinder Singh to be awarded to a needy sikh student. The scholarship will be awarded preferably to the deserving students of M.A. (Pol. Science) and M. Sc. (Chem.) in alternate years. The student must have secured at least Ist class marks in the previous examination. The scholarship will be awarded at the discretion of the Principal.
6. **Sardar Sunder Singh Chhatwal Scholarship:** S. Sunder Singh Chhatwal Scholarship of Rs. 200/- per month is sponsored by his son, S. (The awardee must be committed GURSIKH and AMRITDHARI, have a good academic career preferably Ist class in B.A./M.A. and have a clear and definite interest in Sikh Theology and History). The Awardee must be a committed Gursikh, have a good academic career studying at the university level in Khalsa College, Amritsar and have a clear and definite interest in Sikh Theology and History.
7. **Bibi Sita Chhatwal (Satwant Kaur) Scholarship:** This Scholarship is sponsored by Amar Singh Chhatwal, Managing Editor, The Sikh Courier International and general secretary, the sikh cultural society of Great Britain, 88, Mollison way, Edgware, Greater London in memory of his wife. The Awardee must be a committed Gursikh, have a good academic career studying at the university level in Khalsa College, Amritsar and have a clear and definite interest in Sikh Theology and History.
8. **Sardar Santokh Singh Chawla Scholarship:** The scholarship of Rs. 100/- per month is awarded to student who stands first in B.Com. Ist year in the college (and it shall be payable for 10 months in year) provided he rejoins the next class in the college.
9. **Sardarni Bhagwanti, Sardar Santokh Singh Chawla Scholarship:** This Scholarship of Rs. 100/- per month for 10 months is awarded to the student standing first in plus two (Medical) in the college provided he/she joins the next class in this college.
10. **S. Narain Singh, Gurdip Kaur Hassan Scholarship:** Two Scholarships from the interest on FDR to be awarded annually to one each of the Science and Arts students on the basis of their merit and financial need. The students for the scholarship will be selected jointly by the Principal and Dr. Avtar Singh
11. **Dr. Bhagat Singh Thind Scholarship:** In honour of his wife Vivian Thind, out of interest on the endowment fund to be given two merit holder and economically poor Sikh students got admission in B.A. and B.Sc. (Medical) or B.Sc. (Non-Medical).
12. **Late Sardar Kanwaljit Singh Arora Husband of Mrs. Chand Kaur Arora Scholarship/Gold Medal:** Four Scholarships of Rs. 450/- each i.e. Rs. 50/- per month for a period of 9 months. 13. **S. Naunidh Singh Stipend:** This stipend, equivalent to tuition fee, is given to a fatherless and poor student in order of merit.
