Notes on the transcript of grades

The Diploma Programme

Diploma candidates are required to study six subjects: one subject from each of groups 1 to 5 and a sixth subject from group 6 or an elective. The electives include a second subject from groups 1 to 4, further mathematics SL, computer science and a school-based syllabus approved by the IB.

Group 1: language A1	Language A1	First language, the study of literature including selections from world literature.
Group 2: second language	Language A2	A language and literature course for fluent or bilingual candidates.
	Language B	A foreign language course for candidates with previous experience of the language.
	Language <i>ab initio</i>	A foreign language course for beginners.
	Classical languages	Classical Greek, Latin.
Group 3: individuals and societies		History, geography, economics, philosophy, psychology, social and cultural anthropology, business and management, information technology in a global society (ITGS), world religions.
Group 4: experimental sciences		Biology, chemistry, physics, design technology, sports exercise and health science pilot.
Group 5: mathematics and computer science		Mathematics HL, mathematics SL, mathematical studies SL, further mathematics SL, computer science (elective only).
Group 6: the arts		Visual arts, music, theatre, film, dance pilot.
Additionally:		Text and performance: pilot transdisciplinary between groups 1 and 6. Environmental systems and societies: transdisciplinary between group 3 and 4.

At Least three and not more than four of the six subjects are taken at higher level (HL), the others at standard level (SL). Each examined subject is graded on a scale of 1 (minimum) to 7 (maximum). The award of the diploma requires a minimum total of 24 points and the satisfactory completion of three additional requirements: the extended essay of some 4000 words, which provides a first experience of preparing an independent research paper; a course entitled theory of knowledge (TOK), which is an interdisciplinary requirement intended to stimulate critical reflection on knowledge and experience gained inside and outside the classroom; and the compulsory participation in creativity, action, service (CAS). Approximately 80% of candidates are awarded the diploma. Diploma candidates who completed more than six subjects receive a certificate for the additional subject(s).

Grading and results

A candidate's examination performance in individual subjects is graded according to the following scale: N No grade, 1. Very poor performance, 2. Poor performance, 3. Mediocre performance, 4. Satisfactory performance, 5. Good performance, 6. Very good performance, 7. Excellent performance.

Theory of knowledge and the extended essay are graded according to the scale: N. No grade, E. Elementary performance, D. Mediocre performance, C. Satisfactory performance, B. Good performance, A. Excellent performance.

The diploma candidate's six subjects can therefore yield 42 points. Three further points are available for the combination of the extended essay and work in theory of knowledge. The maximum possible score is therefore 45 points. A candidate's transcript is normally marked DIPLOMA AWARDED or CERTIFICATE AWARDED. The BILINGUAL DIPLOMA AWARDED indicates that the candidate has offered two languages A1, or has language A1 taken together with a language A2, or a group 3 or 4 subject taken in a language other than the candidate's language A1 or an extended essay in a group 3 or group 4 subject written in a language other than the candidate's language A1.

The candidate who does not satisfy the requirements of the full programme, or who has elected to take fewer than six subjects, is awarded a certificate for the examinations completed.
